Curriculum - This term we will be using child centred activities and books to celebrate various festivals including Bonfire Night, Diwali, the German festival of St. Martin and the Christmas celebration of St. Nikolaus. We will also commemorate Remembrance Sunday.

Sound of the Week - Starting this term, we will be introducing a weekly phonic sound. Each week we will be exploring a letter sound through fun phonic songs and activities and will be giving children the opportunity to go on 'sound hunts' around the setting. You can support your child to learn phonics at home by helping them to find items that begin with the sound of the week, which they can bring into preschool for our 'Sounds Basket' and to share with their friends. When introducing children to phonics it is useful to remember to use the 'sound' that the letter makes and not the letter name, but if you would like more information about phonics then please speak to your child's key person or look at the [Resources](#) section of our website for helpful tips.

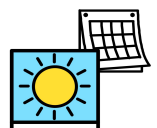

SPECIAL EVENTS FOR THIS TERM – DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

Children in Need: Friday 14th Nov. We will be organising a Pudsey Bear fun day and any donations received will be passed on to Children in Need; details to follow.

Christmas Sing-along: Parents are invited to join us for a Christmas sing-along on **Tuesday 9th December at 2:00**. The sing-along will be followed by a bring and buy cake sale and Christmas raffle. We hope you will be able to join us but due to limitations with space we can only invite two people per child. All children and families are invited so if your child does not attend this session please arrive at 1:45. If you have any suitable raffle prizes, please let us know!

End of Term Christmas Party – Friday 19th Dec. Our Christmas party will be held during the morning session and will mark the end of term so there is no afternoon session on this day. All children are invited to attend so if your child does not normally attend this session please bring them along for a morning of fun games and activities and a visit from Santa. Please collect children 11:45 - 12:00.

Family Celebrations: Please let us know if you have any special cultural celebrations or ways of celebrating that are different to traditional English customs so we can broaden our horizons and include them in our planning.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION. Please can we remind you of the following:

Sickness: If children are sick for any reason they must not return to pre-school until at least 48 hrs after the last bout of sickness. This also applies to cases of diarrhoea.

Illnesses: We ask parents to continue to be vigilant in keeping their child at home if they are unwell for any reason. We have had lots of colds, coughs and sore throat bugs being spread around pre-school due to children attending when they are poorly. The pre-school day is busy and if children are feeling under the weather it is better for them stay at home and recuperate until they are fully recovered. Please help us to minimise infections and keep everyone well by not sending children until they are fully fit and well.

Dress Code: In order for children to develop self-help skills and gain confidence in looking after themselves please dress children in clothing that they can easily manage themselves. Trousers and leggings that can be easily pulled up and down are best for accessing the toilet and preventing accidents. It is also essential that children have warm outdoor clothing to wear every day as they will be accessing outdoor learning at some point during the day. Children need to have suitable footwear for running & climbing, and coats to ensure they are kept warm and dry. Please check your child's spare clothes bag to ensure that the clothes are suitable for the change of season.

Lunchboxes: Please remember that due to health and safety and choking hazards the following items are prohibited from children's lunchboxes: **popcorn, tube yoghurts (e.g. Frubes), nuts/nut butters. Any round items such as grapes, cherry tomatoes, olives, sausages etc. need to be sliced lengthways.**

STORY OF THE WEEK

SECRET READER

To support literacy development we would like different people to come into the setting to be our 'secret reader'. This involves coming in for around 30 minutes to read a story (nothing too scary and staff will support you!) and the invitation is also open to grandparents and relatives as well. If you are able to come in please speak to a member of staff to book a convenient date and time and remember not to tell your child as we want it to be a surprise!

Inclusive and Diverse resources: Thanks to previous years' fundraising efforts, we have been able to update our library with books and resources that reflect a wider range of ethnicities, languages, abilities and disabilities, genders and family dynamics. We have been able to purchase high quality story books rather than information books, so children are able to identify with the characters and see positive images represented in the stories they love. Staff have been undergoing training and using reflective practice to identify how to improve on current practice and our work has been recognised and praised by the Local Authority. This is still a work in progress and we would welcome any comments or support you may want to give. Please email us if you would like any more information.

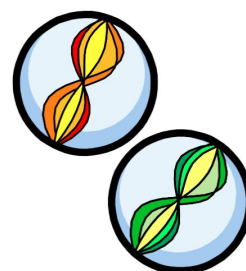
WORKING WITH THE DOGS TRUST

It is very important that children know how to keep themselves safe around dogs both in the home and when they are out in the community. A while ago we were fortunate to work alongside The Dogs Trust on an action research programme to help them develop teaching resources for preschool children. We continue to use these resources during the year to help children feel more confident and to keep safe around dogs. E-SAFETY

As part of our safeguarding responsibilities we will be talking to the children about how to keep themselves safe both in the real world and online. This term we will be specifically looking at appropriate use of devices, especially the need to switch off from screens and the internet at bed time. We will explore these messages using the book Webster's Bedtime and other age appropriate resources. Marble Jar: Over the last few weeks your child may have told you they have 'put a marble in the jar' which is another way we use to reward children. Whenever a child is kind, helpful or has worked to achieve their best they are rewarded by adding a marble to our jar. When the marble jar is full the whole group has a treat and the treat is decided by the children. If your child tells you they've been able to put a marble in the jar be sure to give them lots of praise!

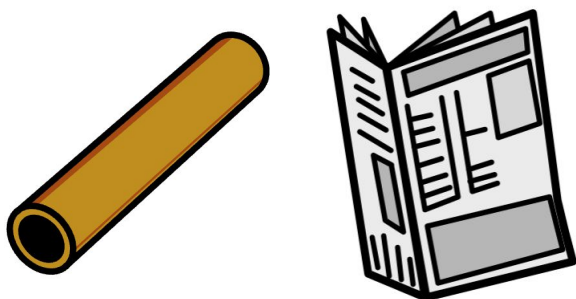

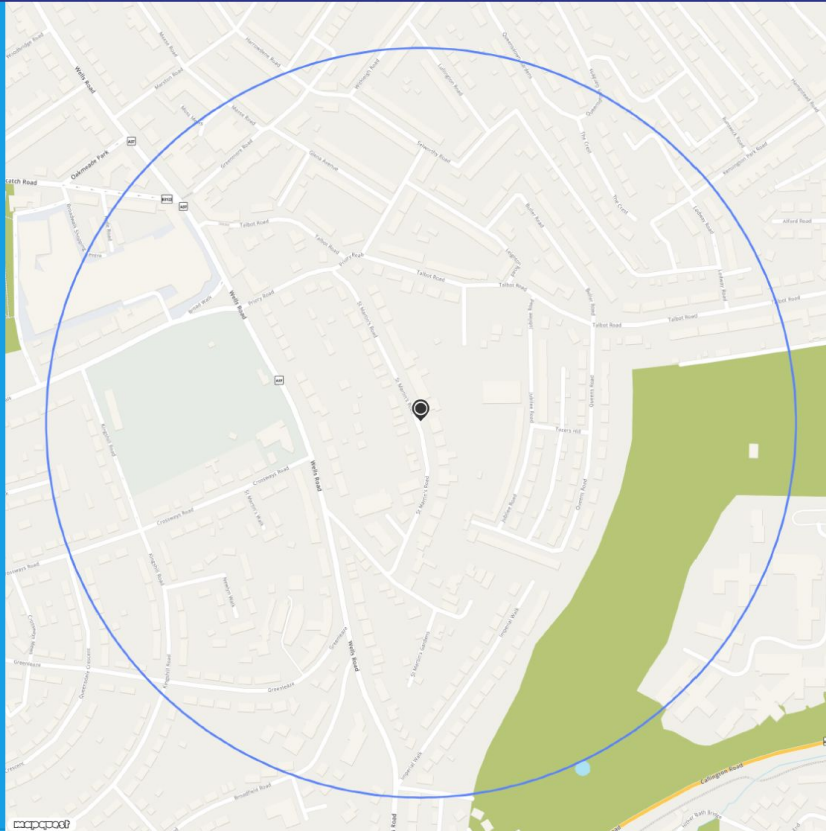
